WELCOME NEW MANAGEMENT COMPANY



Recycle Unwanted Electronics

Don't know what to do with your old TV? Bring it to the city of Clearwater's Monthly Electronics Drop-off Day. Residents can bring electronics to the drop-off facility on the last Wednesday of every month from 7 am to 3 pm at 1701 N. Hercules Ave., Clearwater residents with proof of residency (a utility bill) may dispose of unwanted electronics for free. Hazardous electronics accepted include TVs, monitors, laptops, power supplies, CPUs, cell phones and other devices with rechargeable batteries. For more information, call 562-49202.



Woodlake Safety

ALERT: Solicitors on Woodlake Property

Woodlake is Private Property. There has been an increase in solicitors going door to door in our community. The other thing to keep in mind, not all solicitors are honest, many are looking for vacant units, that can be burglarized.

If any solicitor comes to your door, or approaches you on this property- ASK FOR THEIR PERMIT FROM CITY OF CLEARWATER.

If they say they don't have one, ask them to leave immediately, they are trespassing.

Then contact Clearwater Police at

727-562-4242, with the description of solicitor, they can remove person from our property if they do not leave when asked.

During this pandemic, people are losing their jobs and getting desperate for income. Please remember for your safety, do not let a solicitor into your home.

Do not provide any personal information to anyone that does not have a permit to solicit in Clearwater If they do have a permit, you can call police to verify.

Dumpster areas

Please remember- NOTHING is to be left on the ground in dumpster areas. Hiding big items out of sight BEHIND the metal bins is not the solution.

Please take all large items- to the dumpster area in northwest corner of property that backs up to the park.

Remember, dumpsters are for BAGGED, household trash ONLY.

The dumpster areas ARE NOT Donation Stations for your unwanted items. Salvation Army, Goodwill and other agencies are able to help you if you have items to donate.

STAY SAFE AND STAY WELL
